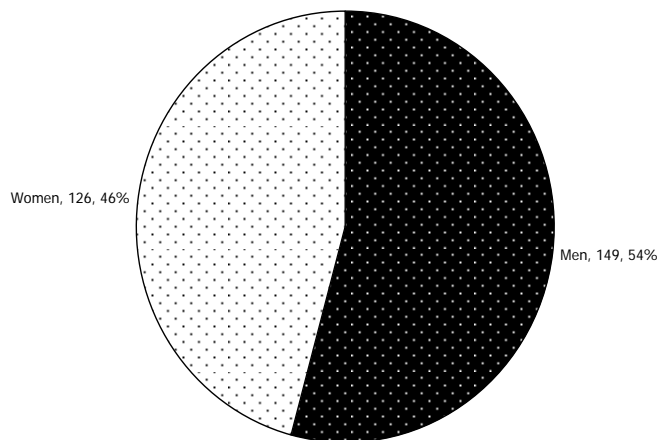


National Refugee Teachers Database Summary Covering March-May 2008 quarter

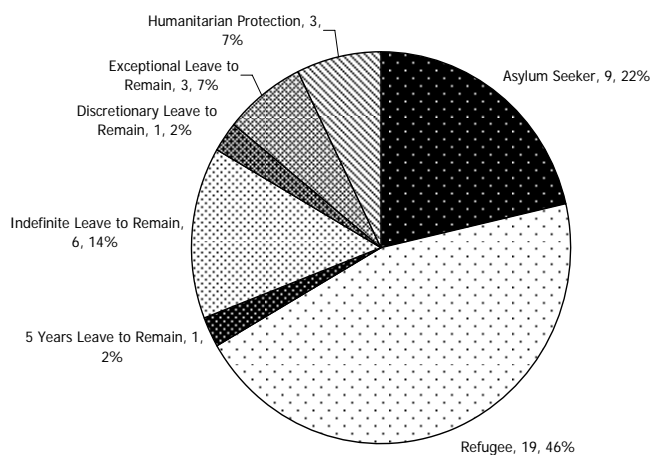
- 275 teachers registered up to 31st May 2008. 46% of all registrations are female and 54% male.

by 31.05.2008**



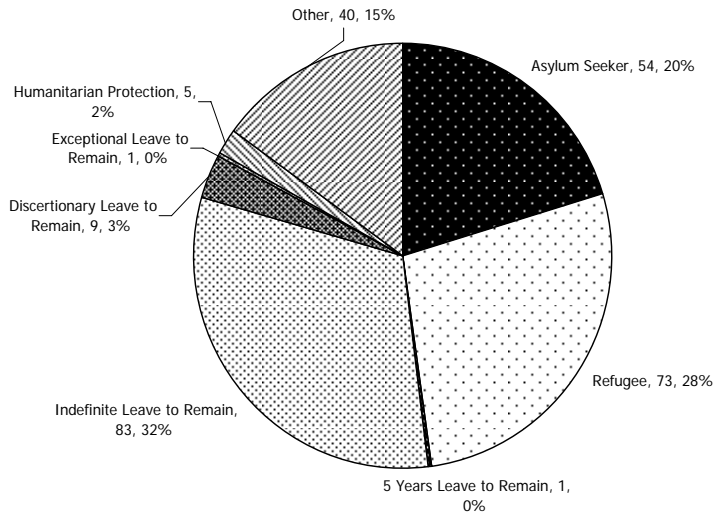
- 22% of March-May 08 registrants stated they were claiming asylum at the time of registration

- 20% of all registrants by 31.05.08 stated they were claiming asylum at the time of the registration

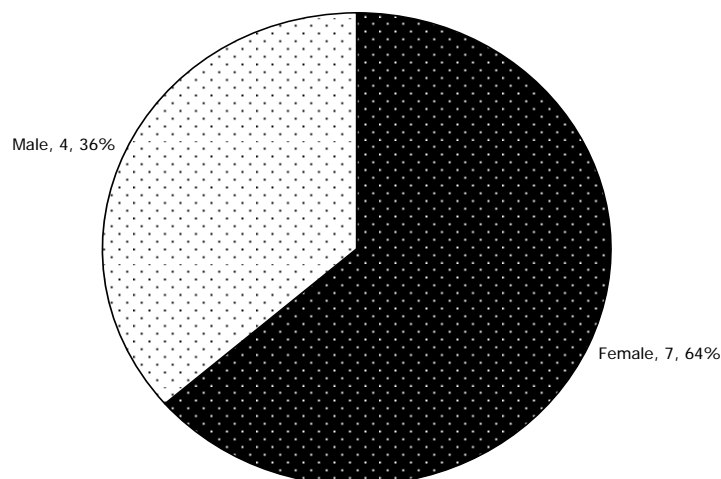
Immigration Status of All Teachers Registered up to 31.05.2008



- 11 of the registrants between March and May 08 stated that they wanted to teach at primary level – 4 of these were male and 7 female

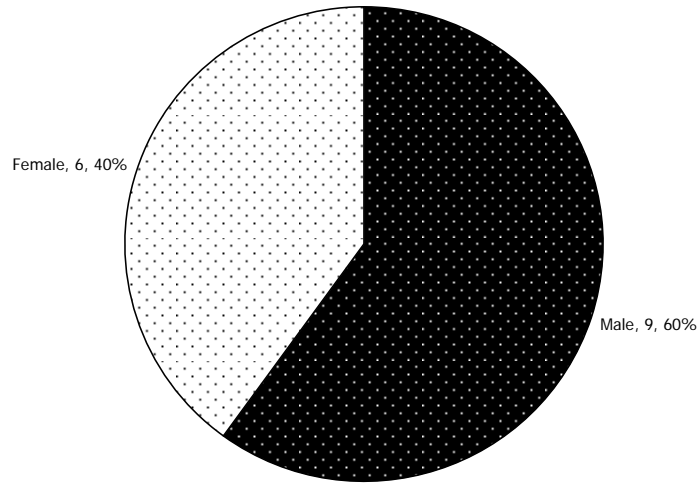
Gender of Teachers Interested in Teaching at Primary Level

Enquiries received between 01.03. and 31.05.2008 by region

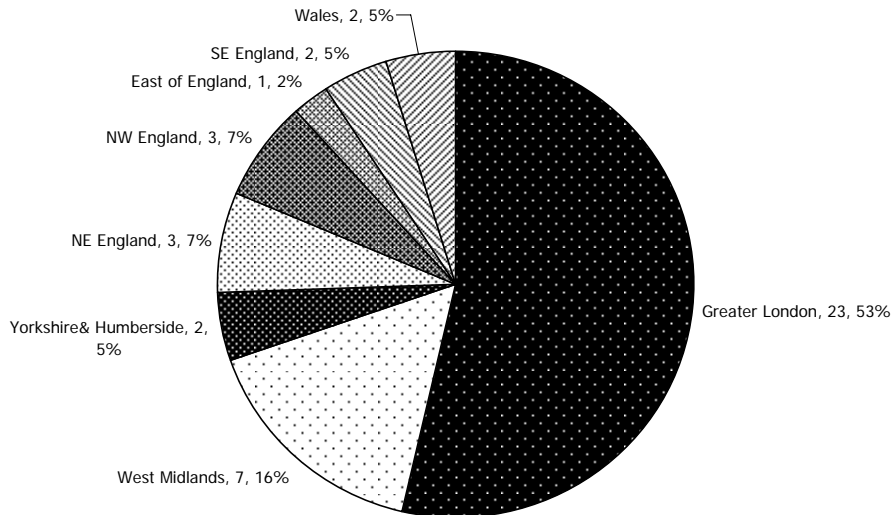
