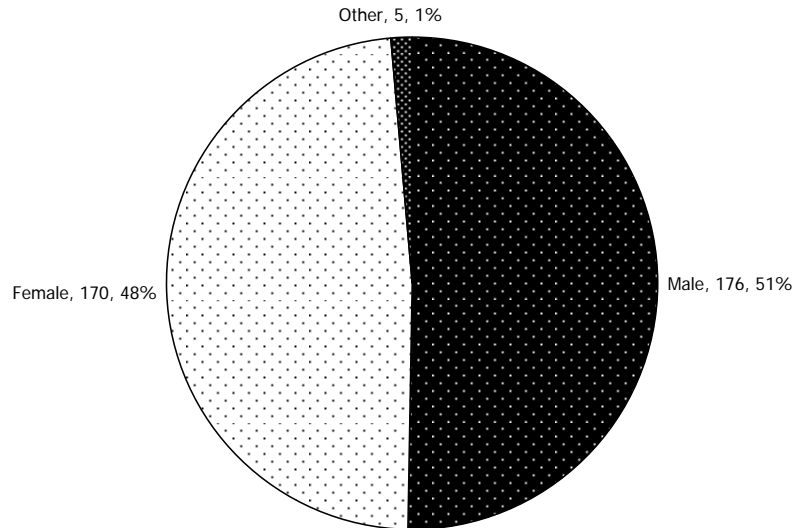


National Refugee Teachers Database Summary Covering June -August 2008 quarter

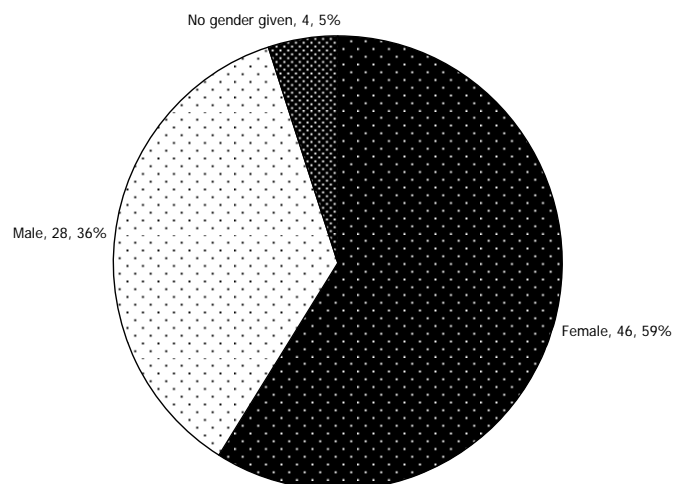
- Total of 351 Refugee Teachers were registered on the national database by the end of August 2008. 51% of these are males and 48% females.

- 78 registrations were received in the June –August 2008 quarter, 46 of these are females and 28 males.

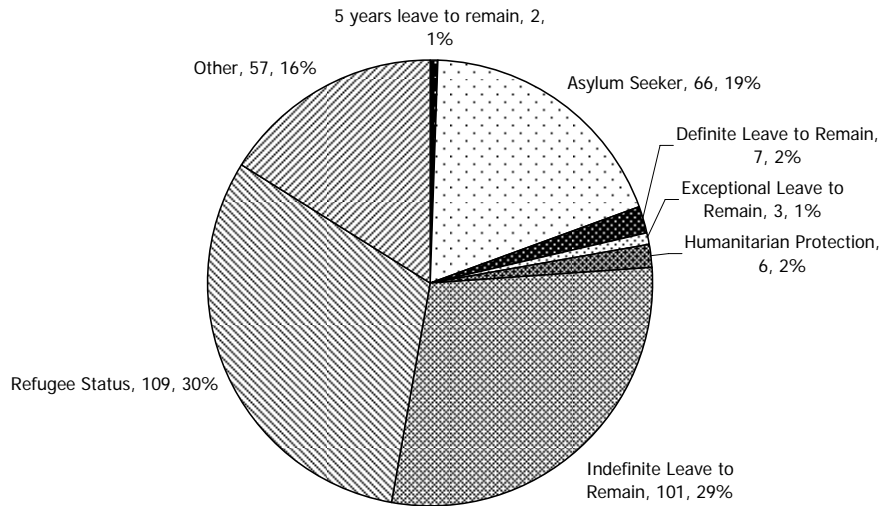
Gender of Teachers Registered in June -August 08 quarter



Refugees *into* Teaching

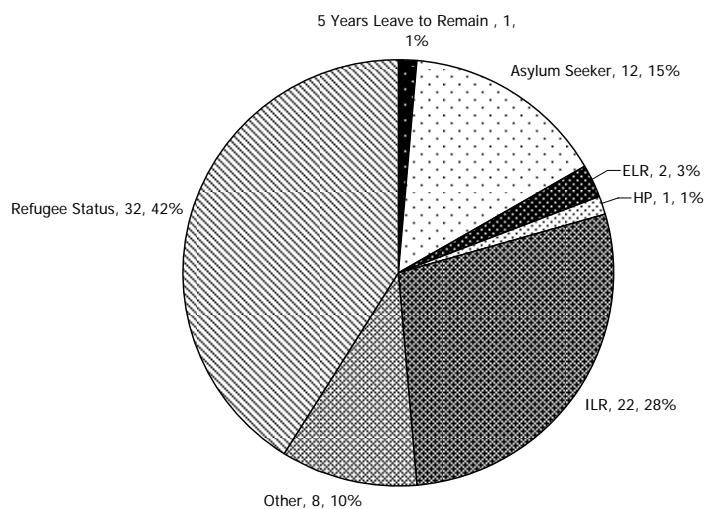
- From all registrations received by 31/08/08 30% had refugee status, 29% Indefinite Leave to Remain and 19% were asylum seekers.

- 32 of the teachers registered in the June – August 08 quarter have Refugee Status, 12 are seeking asylum and 22 have Indefinite Leave to Remain.

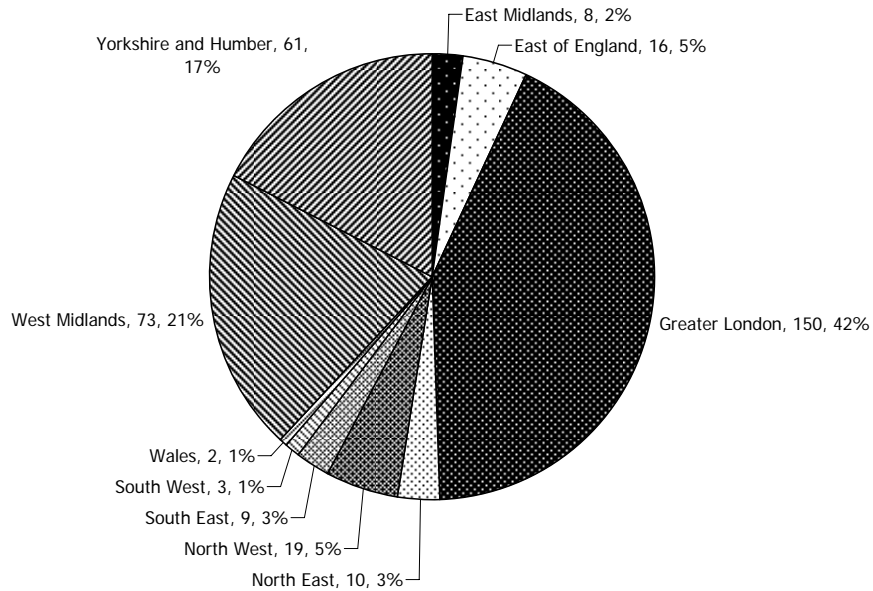
Immigration Status June -August 08 Quarter

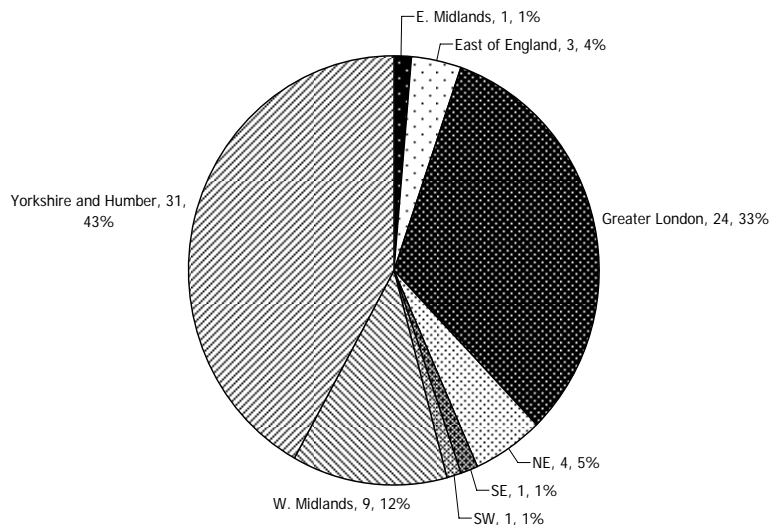
- From all registrations received by 31.08.2008 42% were from Greater London area, 21% from West Midlands and 17% from Yorkshire and Humberside.

- 43% of the registrations received in the June –August quarter were from Yorkshire and Humberside, 33% from the Greater London area and 12% from the West Midlands

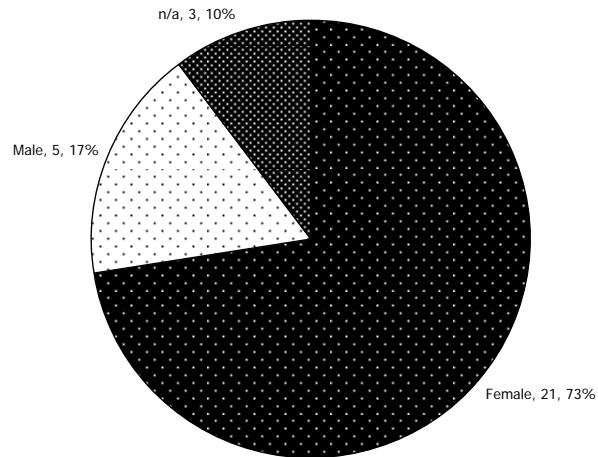
Registrations from June August 08 Quarter by Region



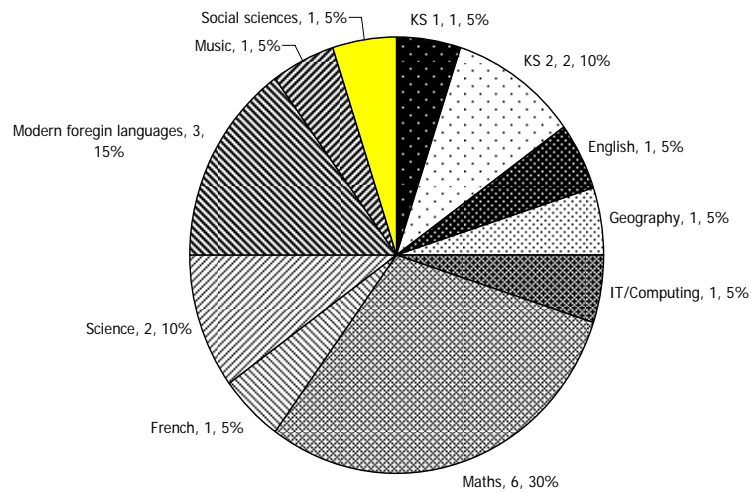
Refugees *into* Teaching

- 29 of the registered teachers are interested in teaching at primary level.

Teachers Interested on Teaching at Primary Level by Gender



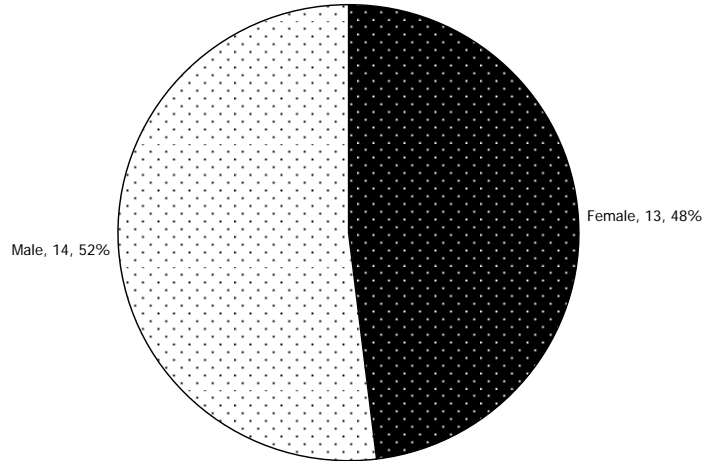
Subject Areas Primary Level Teachers Interested in Teaching



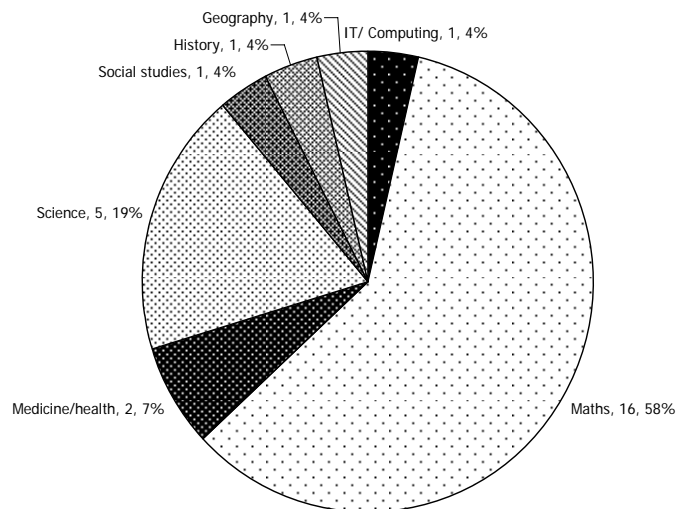
Refugees *into* Teaching

- 27 of the registered teachers are interested on teaching at secondary level. 58% are interested on teaching mathematics and 19% science.

Teachers Interested in Teaching at Secondary Level by Gender



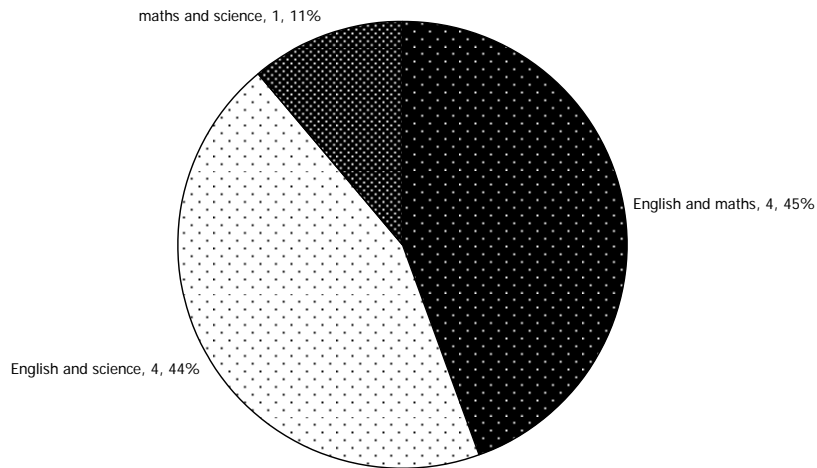
Subject Areas Secondary Level Teachers Interested in Teaching



Refugees *into* Teaching

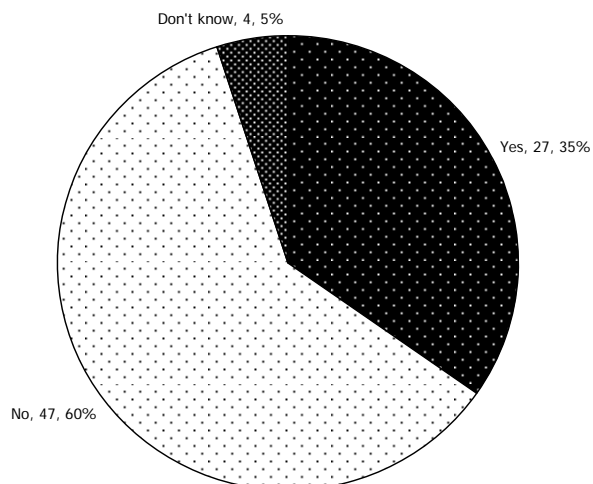
- 7 of the registered teachers had no GCSEs at the time of registration, 38 had maths, science and English.
2 of the teachers had English only, 7 had only maths and 1 had science only.
4 of the teachers had both English and maths, 4 had both English and science and 1 had both maths and science

- 35% of the teachers had CRB check completed at the time of registration, 60% had not had the check done yet.

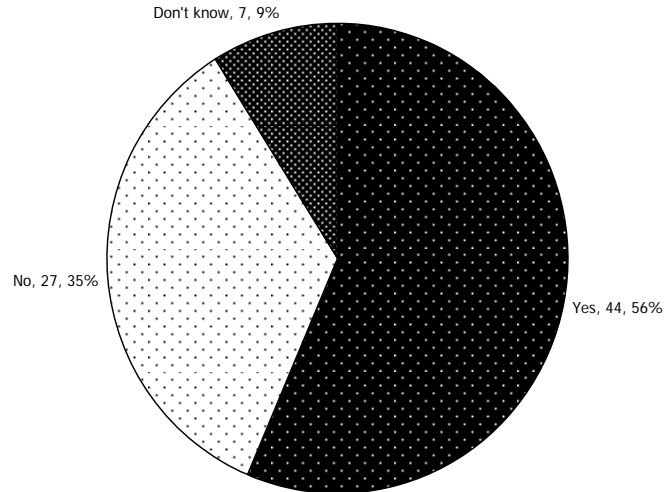
Criminal Bureau Records Check Status



Refugees *into* Teaching

- 56% of the registered teachers had had their qualifications compared by UK NARIC at the time of the registrations and 35% had not had their qualifications compared yet.
